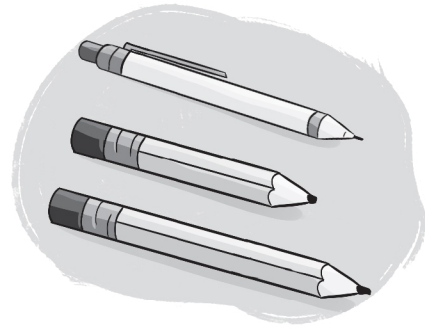
Welcome to Possibilities Cartoon Academy! We'll show you how to cartoon like a pro! You'll learn to draw people and other things too!

Practice with us over the next few pages, and you'll graduate from the Academy. Then use your new skills to cartoon amazing adventures!



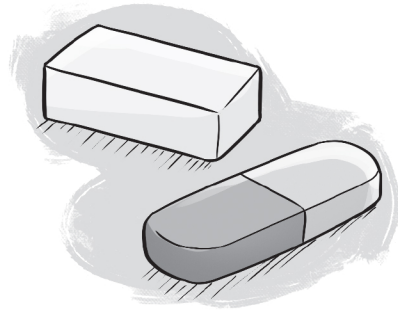
1 PENCILS

With all materials close at hand, the flow of work won't be interrupted!

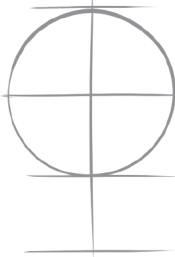
FACES



You can create fantastic faces with basic shapes and lines to guide you!

FRONT VIEW

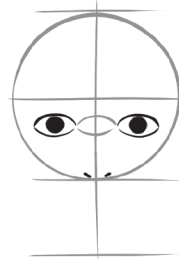

Draw a circle and divide it in half.

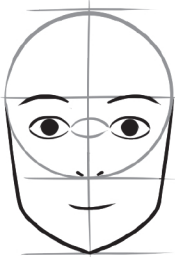
Add another half below, so you have 3 equal parts.

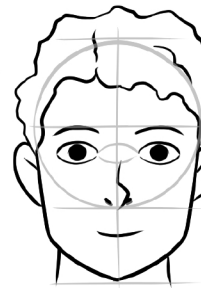
Draw the eyes below the second line, and nostrils above the third line.

Draw the mouth between the nose and chin, but slightly closer to the nose.

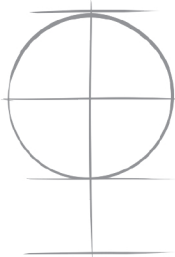


Draw hair that sits above the top curve of the head, unless your character is bald!

Draw ears below the second line and curve them in just above the third line.

PROFILE VIEW

Draw a circle and divide it in half.

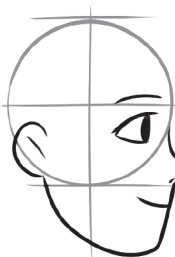
Add another half below, so you have 3 equal parts.

Draw the ear below the second line and curve it in just above the third line.

Draw the mouth between the nose and chin, but slightly closer to the nose.

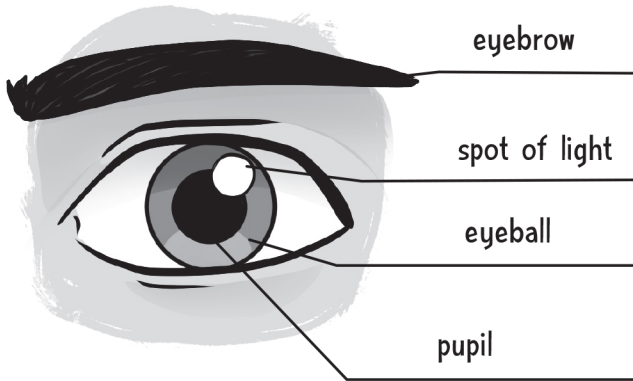
Draw the hair last.

Smooth hair sits on the top curve of the head, but other styles can sit above it.

EYES



Eyes are drawn using basic shapes, like a circle or square. Left and right eyes need to be drawn in different directions.



PRO TIP

Add a spot of light on each eyeball. Make sure the spot is on the same side for the left and right eye so it looks like the light is coming from one direction only. Look at the spots of light in the example.



Notice how the eyes are drawn pointing towards each other.
